Location:

Canton is located in northeastern Ohio in Stark County. It is about one hour south of Cleveland and two hours northeast of Columbus. The city has a total area of 20.6 square miles (cantonohio.gov).

History:

Canton was founded in 1805, incorporated as a village in 1822, and became a city in 1838. According to the Canton City website, a surveyor named Bezaleel Wells divided the town and named it after Canton, China, a tribute to a trader whom Wells admired (2012). Once founded, Canton became a center for manufacturing due to its many railroads, and after the manufacturing business declined the city's industry has transferred to service economy such as retailing, education, financial and healthcare sectors (cantonohio.gov).

Emotional Tone:

The City of Canton website states that Canton "provides its residents with many benefits of big-city living while maintaining its charm as a medium-sized Midwestern town" (cantonohio.gov). Canton is well known for being the birthplace of professional American football. The city also proudly contains attractions such as the NFL Pro Football Hall of Fame, the William McKinley Presidential Library, and the National First Ladies Library and Research Center. Canton also has a rich arts community which they celebrate on the first Friday of every month by holding events to showcase what the community has to offer in the downtown arts district.

Fear/Tension:

While crime rates have fallen in the past few years, crime is still very prevalent in Canton (cantonohio.gov). There were 6,866 major crimes in Canton in 2009, which is still much higher than the surrounding neighborhoods (cantonohio.gov). The Canton police department and Mayor Healy have attributed these declines to the city's "zero tolerance" police efforts. These efforts are funded in part by the Northeast Ohio Violent Crime Consortium (NOVCC). These efforts include police activity such as gang surveillance, drug enforcement raids, illegal gun busts, highway interdictions, arrest warrant sweeps, and patrols of vacant homes (cantonohio.gov).

Positive Outlook:

The mayor is working to attract new companies and businesses to the city. These efforts include the utilization of incentive programs (cantonohio.gov). One of these programs is called Canton Entrepreneur Launch which provides grants to entrepreneurs who are planning on starting their businesses in Canton (cantonlaunch.org). Canton has also developed a neighborhood betterment plan for various neighborhoods called the Canton Neighborhood Project (cantonohio.gov). This project aims to create neighborhoods in Canton where people would like to live.

Community Pride:

A lot of community pride comes from Canton being the birthplace of American Football. The yearly festivities surrounding the Hall of Fame inductions bring in mass amounts of tourists and revenue. The city also hosts First Friday, in which the community gets together to celebrate the arts and culture of Canton.

Housing Conditions:

The Canton Neighborhood Project recognizes that there are too many houses to serve its population (cantonohio.gov/housing). There are many houses that are vacant and need demolished, and also many houses that are in need of fixing. This project serves to promote the betterment of neighborhoods around Canton by informing and supporting the citizens to make changes.

Building Conditions:

The buildings in Canton According to the City of Canton website, there are building code officers out in the city and neighborhoods daily to inspect buildings and ensure that they are safe and not in violation of any building codes (cantonohio.gov/building). However, due to lack of funding and resources, there are many buildings in the Canton area that are in need of repairs.

Cleanliness:

The streets of the downtown areas of Canton appear to be clean and well swept for the most part due to scheduled street sweeping which occurs from March through November (cantonohio.gov). However, the outskirts and neighborhoods are not as well kept, and private homes can tend to be poorly maintained. Canton also participates in an adopt-a-site program in which area organizations can adopt a small site in the city and be responsible for upkeep, landscaping, and beautification (cantonohio.gov).

Fire Protection:

There are ten fire stations located around the Canton area. Along with responding to fire emergencies, the fire department is also responsible for setting forth rules regarding private fires in the community. The Canton Fire Department website provides information regarding the regulations of recreational fires, and required forms in order to approve them (cantonohio.gov/fire). They also provide tips for year-round fire safety including proper use of smoke detectors and using caution when cooking with outdoor fires.

Police Protection:

The city of Canton has its own police department which is divided into several divisions such as the patrol and investigative divisions. The department boasts plummeting crime rates in the city of Canton (cantonohio.gov/police). Police headquarters are located at 1492 Washington St, Canton, Ohio 02021. The police department also strives to connect and collaborate with the community by providing programs such as the citizen's police academy (cantonpolice.com).

School System:

Canton City Schools has an enrollment of approximately 10,200 students and is the largest school district in Stark County. Canton City Schools is also one of the largest school districts within the state of Ohio. "The district comprises two high schools (each with a freshman academy), three middle schools, and 14 elementary schools. In addition, the district operates five alternative high schools, one alternative middle school and helps operate a Montessori school, a Digital Academy, and an Arts Academy" (www.ccsdistrict.org/about). Students who attend Canton City Schools have a wide variety of opportunities to participate in athletics, the arts, and other extracurricular activities. Canton City Schools also participates in a state-driven building program called "Design for the Future", that has allowed the district to renovate or build new schools (approx. 19).

Water supply: Canton Water Department

The Canton Water Department obtains 100% of its water from underground wells. The wells extend hundreds of feet deep into sand and gravel aquifers that were created long ago by glacial activity. These natural aquifers provide Canton with an average of 24 million gallons of water per day. There are three separate well fields that supply water to three water treatment plants. The City also has 27 million gallons of drinking water stored in enclosed reservoirs. This quantity represents about one day's supply of water and is kept in reserve as a precautionary measure.

Health department – food inspection programs:

The food inspection program requires the owner to submit a set of plans of the facility drawn to scale. The plans should identify the kitchen area and all other areas pertaining to the operation. All finishes used in the operation must be durable, smooth and easily cleanable. The make and model numbers of all the equipment that will be installed in the facility needs to be submitted. The type of lighting installed needs to be disclosed. A copy of the menu or list of foods that will be either served or sold needs to be submitted. This enables the health department to determine if there is enough refrigeration, cooking or hot holding equipment and if there is enough space for dry storage in the facility. Upon completion of all the health department's requirements along with a satisfactory inspection by the health department they will issue an application for a food service license or a food establishment license. There is an online Food Service/Establishment Inspection Reports for all facilities which are licensed through the health department are required, by law, to be inspected by the health

department. The number of inspections per licensing period depends on the risk level it has been given.

The Collection Systems Department's primary mission is to provide a business-like approach to the operation and management for the City of Canton's 500 miles of underground sewers. The Collection System's personnel are trained in the efficient use of high velocity sewer cleaners, Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) equipment, and other large pieces of construction equipment to tackle most any type of cleaning or digging job to keep the sewers running efficiently and properly.

The City of Canton has a long history, dating back to the late 1800's, of engineers designing and installing sewer systems that range from 6 to 72 inches in diameter. These sewers in turn collect and transport wastewater to the City's Water Reclamation Facility, located at 3530 Central Avenue S.E. This is where our entire residential, commercial and industrial wastewater is properly treated and disposed of prior to discharging into the Nimishillen Creek.

Under Ohio Revised Code Section Chapter 729, the department funding is collected solely through residents' monthly sewer rates.

The Water Reclamation Facility (WRF) of the City of Canton, Ohio is responsible for treating all sanitary sewage that flows to the facility from a variety of sources throughout the greater Stark County area.

The WRF was previously known as the Water Pollution Control Center, but was changed to its current title in 2008 to more accurately reflect the duties and functions of the facility. The "reclaiming" of this water occurs prior to discharge into the Nimishillen Creek, which flows next to the treatment plant.

The Sanitation Department services roughly 34,000 structures in the city every week. This amounts to approximately 43,000 tons (86 million pounds) of garbage every year from Canton residents. Trash collection will take place in all weather, though the crews will not pick up garbage if the temperature falls below -5° Fahrenheit. The size of trash cans to be lifted by Sanitation Employees is limited to 32 gallons or less. If the can has a lid, it must be a separate lid and not attached or hinged to the can. Trash should not be set out at the curb before 6:00 PM the evening before scheduled pick-up. Please keep in mind that if animals get into trash bags, clean-up is the customer's responsibility.

Not all materials are accepted. This includes: asphalt, concrete, bricks, roofing material, tree stumps, logs, railroad ties, auto parts, ashes, rocks, dirt, paint, or other hazardous liquids of any time. If you have a question, please call the office. Animal fecal matter will not be picked up unless placed in a small, sturdy double plastic bag, or wrapped in newspaper and placed in a small, sturdy plastic bag. Cat litter can be placed in coffee cans, sturdy plastic bags, or grocery bags that are placed inside plastic bags. Tires will not be picked up, but can be dropped off free of charge (tires only - no rims) at the Schroyer Recycling Drop-off facility located at 742 Schroyer Ave SW, Canton, OH 44707. The center is located between 6th and 9th Street SW on Schroyer. They are open Monday, Wednesday, and Friday 10:00 AM till 2:00 PM. To contact the drop-off center, call (330) 430-7869.

The Air Pollution Control Division of the Canton City Health Department is one of nine local agencies within the State of Ohio that serves its individual community by providing local management and protection of the areas outside air quality. The primary purpose of the Air Pollution Control Division is to protect Stark County citizens from the adverse health and welfare impacts of air pollution by attaining and maintaining ambient air quality standards. This is accomplished through monitoring levels of ambient air pollutants, Air Quality Index (AQI), implementation of the State's industrial permit program and enforcement of state & federal clean air regulations.

The division operates a network of air quality monitoring stations throughout Stark County for the purpose of capturing and analyzing ambient air samples which are representative and indicative of the quality of air to which area residents are exposed. The Division's work activities include preparing permits for stationary industrial air pollution sources, performing

facility inspections for permit compliance, performing complaint investigations, and pursuing enforcement actions for non-compliance. In addition, the division performs similar work activities for state & federal regulations governing the removal, handling and disposal of Asbestos as it relates to renovation and demolition of buildings, emissions of perchloroethylene from dry cleaners, emissions from gasoline stations and vehicle anti-tampering, and Open Burning. Air pollution sources include industrial smoke stacks, industrial equipment, roadways and other areas that generate dust.

EPA programs:

Ohio EPA's Northeast District Office, located in Twinsburg, Ohio, serves 15 counties including Stark County. District personnel review permit applications; evaluate sites for proposed facilities; investigate complaints; inspect facilities; identify environmental violations and prepare recommendations for enforcement; provide technical assistance; and maintain contact with the public.

EPA programs covered for Stark County are listed below.

Air Pollution: Canton City Health Dept. APC Division 330-489-3385

The 1970 federal Clean Air Act and its 1990 amendments require U.S. EPA to set clean air standards to protect public health and welfare. Ohio EPA's Division of Air Pollution Control has adopted rules that ensure those standards are met throughout Ohio. To protect Ohio's air quality, Ohio EPA annually reviews approximately 750 requests for permits for new or modified air pollution sources, and 262 requests for renewal permits. A permit can cover multiple sources of air pollution. Ohio has more than 700 major sources that require comprehensive state and federal operating permits.

Ohio EPA requires continuous monitoring of emissions at 115 facilities, including more than 350 major pollution sources. Staff conduct biannual inspections of facilities that emit more than 100 tons of air pollution per year, and all facilities that emit regulated levels of hazardous air pollutants.

Solid, Infectious, and Hazardous Waste: Joshua Adams 330-963-1103

The Division of Materials and Waste Management implements Ohio's solid waste, infectious waste, hazardous waste, and construction and demolition debris programs. In addition to a traditional regulatory program, the division's core responsibilities include resources dedicated to research and promotion of emerging concepts and technologies associated with resource conservation, materials management, and sustainability. The division also oversees state and local planning for long-term solid waste management.

Ohio EPA is responsible for implementing the 1974 federal Safe Drinking Water Act and its amendments. The Division of Drinking and Ground Waters regulates all

public water systems that have at least 15 service connections or serve 25 or more people at least 60 days per year. This assures Ohio's citizens an adequate supply of safe drinking water. Private drinking water systems, including residential wells, are not regulated by Ohio EPA, but are under the jurisdiction of local health departments.

Services:

Environmental Health:

The Environmental Health Division's purpose is to protect our community's health through the prevention and control of environmentally related communicable diseases and through the minimization of exposure to environmental health hazards.

Indoor Air:

The mission of the Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) Program is to conduct and promote the coordination of investigations, experiments, demonstrations, surveys, and studies relating to the causes, effects, extent, prevention, and control of indoor pollution in Canton.

Lead:

The Canton City Health Department is committed to helping the children in our community grow up healthy. We want parents, grandparents and care givers throughout our community to learn about lead poisoning and lead poisoning prevention.

Mosquito and Tick:

Canton City is helping to reduce the risk of mosquito-borne disease by: working with homeowners and businesses within the City of Canton to remove all sources of standing water, applying a larvicide to any standing bodies of water that cannot be eliminated, and as a final measure apply an adulticide if necessary.

Pool inspection program:

The goal of the public swimming pool and spa inspection program of the Canton City Health Department is to assure that safe public swimming pools and spas are provided to our citizens.

Rabies Program:

The Canton City Board of Health has passed a resolution (resolution 6/97) that requires all cats in the City of Canton to be properly vaccinated for rabies. This resolution amended chapter 221.11 of the Canton City Health Code, Rabies Control Standards. It

became effective on March 1, 1998, and applies only to the residents of the City of Canton.

Tattoo and Body Piercing Program:

The Tattoo and Body Piercing Program serves to protect public health by licensing and inspecting tattoo and/or body piercing facilities located within Canton city limits. The program provides regulatory oversight / enforcement with the intent to minimize the transmission of bloodborne pathogens and other infectious agents between all parties involved in the tattoo and/or body piercing operations.

Bars:

The City of Canton is not short on bars. There are bars in restaurants, bars with dance floors, and just little hole in the wall bars throughout Canton. Some bars located in Canton are: Ashton's Bar and Grill, John's Bar, Red Dog Saloon, Falcone's Tavern, Loby's Bar and Grill, Reunions Pub, Panini's Bar and Grill, and Mulligan's Pub. According to Kelly Poling from the division of commerce there are 423 issued liquor permits in the City of Canton. The 423 issued liquor license include bars, restaurants, and carry outs. The website, www.com.ohio.gov/liqr, lists issued liquor permits excluding the carry out liquor permits there are 181 bars some of these are located inside restaurants.

Libraries:

There are six libraries in the City of Canton. All of the libraries are open seven days a week. The libraries all have public internet access, book and DVD rentals, and offer interlibrary loans. The libraries located in Canton are: the Main Library on Market Avenue, DeHoff Memorial Branch on Hartford Ave., Madge Youtz Branch on Mahoning Rd. NE, North Branch on 25th St. NW, Plain Community Branch on Schneider St. NE, and Perry Sippo Branch on 12th

St. There is also a Bookmobile that travels to preschools and kindergartens, and to citizens who cannot come to the library.

Shopping Malls:

Canton is full of wonderful places to shop. Canton has retail stores, factory outlets, and unique boutiques. There are several shopping plazas scattered throughout Canton some of these are the 30th Street Plaza, the Carousel Plaza, and the Springbrook Plaza. There is also Canton Centre Mall located on Tuscarawas Street. Nearby in North Canton there is also Westfield Belden Village Mall with a variety of stores for people of all ages.

Public Transportation:

The Stark Area Regional Transit Authority (SARTA), began in 1997 and is now currently providing over 2.1 million rides a year over 8,000 people a day. SARTA's mission is to provide safe, responsive, and effective transportation for all citizens of Stark County. SARTA is meeting its mission by providing transportation to Canton's residents.

Recreation Programs:

The City of Canton has endless recreational programs and activities for residents of all ages. Canton Joint Recreation Center has a variety of recreational programs. Canton Joint Recreation Center is located in the back of Souers Middle School at 2800-13th Street SW and offers year round programs. Some of these programs are: rug rat tee ball, youth tennis lessons, advanced drill and play, girls fastpitch, winter volleyball, adult volleyball, and adult cornhole league. Wellness Programs:

Hospital Based:

Mercy Medical Center has health and wellness programs. These programs include health fairs, blood pressure education and training, cancer awareness, diabetes education and training, smoking cessation, and many more programs. Aultman hospital is committed to the community by offering an array of wellness programs. They have a safety first program that provides free bike helmets and safety education for all first graders in Stark County. Aultman has a Wellness on Wheels van that visits area schools, senior centers, churches and community centers to do basic health screenings and provide health education. They offer more than 100 free educational presentations each year.

Other Wellness Programs:

Many insurance companies offer wellness programs. Participation in wellness programs often result in a discounted deductible or some incentive to get people to take preventative methods which will then in turn save the insurance company money. Many businesses encourage and/or have wellness programs in place to keep their employees healthy and on the job. The Timken Company is one Canton industry that has a wellness program and rewards employees for participating. Are there occupational health nurses?

Yes there are occupational health nurses. The Timken Company has occupational health nurses onsite. The Timken Company is a huge company so it can afford to have onsite nurses. Smaller companies are not as lucky, but Mercy Medical Center provides smaller companies the opportunity to have occupational health nurses through their Work Health and Safety Services. Work Health and Safety Services provide immediate treatment of work-related injuries and illnesses, 24-hour occupational nursing services, drug screens, physical examinations, safety compliance programs, and disease management programs.

VIII. COMMUNITY SLEEP/REST PATTERN

General Atmosphere:

Canton city is generally not a safe place to be at night due to high crime rates. The current crime rates for the city are 683 instances of violent crime and 13 murders reported in 2009. Both of these rates are the highest in Stark County. Stark County totals 1,150 instances for violent crime and 22 murders. The State of Ohio also listed that 64% of the time firearms were used to commit violent crimes and murders in 2008.

After about six or seven PM the city is quiet in downtown areas and has little traffic. The busiest times of day for the city are during business hours (8:00AM-5:00PM). Since 2008, Mayor Healy has implemented strategies, such as adding ten officers to the city's police force, to combat crime in the city. According to his biography, he has also dedicated to spending much of his time improving the safety and security of the city's neighborhoods.

"Open All Night":

There are various gas stations and grocery stores that are open all night. Giant Eagle is open until 12:00PM, and most of the bars in Canton close at 2:30AM. Walmart is open 24 hours at both locations in Canton city. They are located on West Tuscarawas St. and off of Route 62 east.

Highway noise:

Interstate 77 and Route 30 both pass through Canton city limits. The city has constructed a wall on both sides of I-77 to help reduce the noise. The area of the city that is not walled by Route 30 or I-77 is mostly industrial and business districts. Many people have said that they do not hear the noises from the highway, the noises they hear are of sirens of service vehicles and loud exhausts on cars driving down the street.

Airplane noise:

The Akron/Canton airport is located at 5400 Lauby Road NW, in North Canton which is about fifteen minutes north of the city. This is beneficial for the city because an airport can bring business as well as travelers to the city. A negative impact is the noise that an airport can bring to the surrounding area. As a previous resident of the northwest corner of Canton city, I can remember hearing the planes coming in to land at night when other outside noises were quieter. The noise was not loud enough to wake you up at night, but could be heard clearly.

Another noise that can be heard within the city of Canton is from helicopters landing at the two local hospitals. They tend to be louder, and come at sporadic times of day or night whenever they are called to drop off or pick up patients.

Racial/Ethnical Tensions:

An article found in the Canton Repository was posted on April 18, 2009. As of three years ago "race relations in Stark County today are no worse than in previous years, according to people who responded to a Repository online survey" (www.cantonrep.com). Half of the 81 respondents said race relations have stayed the same, with another 42% saying they believe race relations have improved. Most people who responded to the survey said that the race relations in their neighborhoods are good, but there may be some incidence of racism still.

Drug Problems:

In an article posted October 26, 2011, on CantonRep.com, the Canton division of the FBI busted fifteen people in a "Rated R" street gang raid where 125 local, state, and federal officers raided a dozen homes. The people who were targeted were charged with conspiracy to distribute, and possession with the intent to distribute cocaine, crack cocaine, and heroin. The gang has several dozen members and is comprised of generations of families in the Canton Area. The article also stated that "Rated R" is the largest gang in the Canton City area. "Rated R" gang members are also in other articles posted on CantonRep.com associated with drug sales. While this is a large group of individuals targeted by a specific FBI operation, there may be several other individuals involved in drug sales and possession within Canton City. The downward spiral of the economy has left many people within the city jobless, who then may turn to alternative methods of income, such as the distribution of drugs. According to Mayor Healy's biography, he has begun "to implement new strategies to combat crime and reduce the prevalence of drugs, prostitution, and gangs on city streets" (www.cantonohio.gov/mayor).

XII. SUMMARY

List community health patterns that indicate community strengths:

Canton has over 800 acres of parks totaling 40 parks and many mini parks. These parks allow area for families to engage in outdoor activities which can help keep them physically active. Parks can help provide fun ways for children to be active which can help to decrease child obesity. Canton city is most known for the McKinley monument, located just outside of downtown canton overlooking the surrounding park, which is the final resting place for President William McKinley and his wife, the First Lady Ida McKinley. Canton is also known for the Pro Football Hall of Fame which is also located near the monument. These attractions bring revenue and tourists to the city of Canton.

Another strength of the city is that they are making great efforts to bring new businesses into the city through city projects, for example Canton Entrepreneur Launch program (www.cantonohio.gov/business). Canton has many attributes that attract new business to the area, such as being close to highways. State route 30 and I-77 are accessible from any destination in the city. Canton is also very close to the Akron/Canton airport.

Canton City does a great job with garbage disposal. They have a regular trash pickup time that is followed weekly. They also explain holiday schedule trash pick-up times, which can be confusing to residents in depth on their website. Guidelines to what is allowed to be put on the curb for pickup are outlined on their website. If for some reason you don't know what to do with an item, you are always allowed to call and they will direct you what to do. This is very beneficial to Canton City residents, as trash will not accumulate and is properly disposed of.

List community health patterns that indicate community weaknesses:

The overwhelming abundancy of bars located in Canton provides entertainment for adults but intoxicated individuals tend to make unwise choices: drinking and driving, getting into fights, and risky behaviors (unsafe sex- pregnancies, STD's, HIV, drug use). The large numbers of bars can be a weakness of Canton. Another risky behavior that contributes to a weakness of the city is the high crime rates. Canton has the highest crime rates in Stark County.

The city is also under high economic stress. The city of Canton has a large percentage of residents living in poverty compared to the county and state percentages (25.8% vs. 11.6% vs. 13.1% respectively). This is also reflected in the percentage of school children that receive free or reduced lunches at school (82%). Economic stress also is a result of undereducated persons living in the city. The high school graduation rate for the city is 79.9%; this rate is the lower than the county rate of 87.2%. The state graduation rate is 86.8%. This is then perpetuated by the percent of college graduates in the city only being 12.1%. This percentage is very low when compared to the county rate of 19.6% and the state rate of 23.6%. The median income of Stark County is also low when compared to the state median income. This adds to economic problems for the city because the residents are then unable to spend as much money on local business' goods and services.

Community Nursing Diagnosis:

- 25.8% of Canton City residents are living in poverty
- 82% of children attending Canton City Schools receive free or reduced lunch

- Heart Disease, Cancer, and Stroke are the top three causes of death for Canton City
- Minimal options for low-income families to obtain health care (Canton City Health Department, Canton Community Clinic, and Stark County Health Department) only two of these facilities offer dental care as well (Canton Community Clinic and Stark County Health Department)
